Daily Verse and Comment

Matthew 24:29-31

(29) "Immediately after the distress of those days
" 'the sun will be darkened,
and the moon will not give its light;
the stars will fall from the sky,
and the heavenly bodies will be shaken.' (30) "At that time the sign of the
Son of Man will appear in the sky, and all the nations of the earth will
mourn. They will see the Son of Man coming on the clouds of the sky,
with power and great glory. (31) And he will send his angels with a loud
trumpet call, and they will gather his elect from the four winds, from one
end of the heavens to the other.

In Christ's description of His <u>second coming</u> in verses 29-31, He depicts it as a unique occurrence. His return will be so astounding and powerful that the people of <u>this world</u> will quail in fear, thinking that they are all doomed to destruction. His return will not be in secret or done in a corner. It will be wonderful, glorious, frightening, and decisive. And it certainly has not happened yet.

<u>Isaiah 66:14-16</u> is a parallel passage:

When you see this, your heart shall rejoice, and your bones shall flourish like grass; the hand of the Lord shall be known to His servants, and His indignation to His enemies. For behold, the Lord will come with fire and with His chariots, like a whirlwind, to render His anger with fury, and His rebuke with flames of fire. For by fire and by His sword the Lord will judge all flesh; and the slain of the Lord shall be many.

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After building His church, the Bride, to the point that she is complete and ready for the Marriage Supper of the Lamb, <u>Jesus Christ</u> will return in wrath and power as the great Judge to slay His enemies and set up His Kingdom. It will not be a good or fun time. The Day of the Lord is a time of death and destruction. As <u>Amos 5:18</u> says, "It will be darkness, and not light," and not an event in God's Plan that we should desire. While it is necessary for God's justice to be satisfied, it will be a time of appalling loss of life and devastation. In Malachi's words, it will be a "great and dreadful day" (
<u>Malachi 4:5</u>).

In one way, we can be thankful that that Day has not yet come. Would we have been ready if it had? As the days darken toward the return of the <u>King of kings</u>, true Christians need to heed the warnings embedded in these latest disasters and <u>repent</u> of their sins and move even closer to <u>God</u>. Christ *is* preparing His Bride, and she *will* make herself ready for His glorious appearing (<u>Revelation 19:7</u>). If we desire to be part of that Bride, we should do as the apostle Paul advises in <u>Ephesians 5:15-16</u>: "See then that you walk circumspectly, not as fools but as wise, redeeming the time, because the days are evil."
